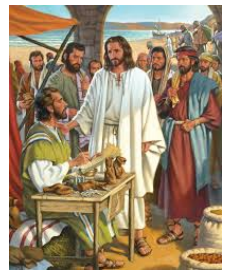

**Reading: Psalm 33.1-12**

<sup>1</sup> Rejoice in the Lord, O you righteous. Praise befits the upright. <sup>2</sup> Praise the Lord with the lyre; make melody to him with the harp of ten strings. <sup>3</sup> Sing to him a new song; play skilfully on the strings, with loud shouts.

<sup>4</sup> For the word of the Lord is upright, and all his work is done in faithfulness. <sup>5</sup> He loves righteousness and justice; the earth is full of the steadfast love of the Lord.

<sup>6</sup> By the word of the Lord the heavens were made, and all their host by the breath of his mouth. <sup>7</sup> He gathered the waters of the sea as in a bottle; he put the deeps in storehouses.

<sup>8</sup> Let all the earth fear the Lord; let all the inhabitants of the world stand in awe of him. <sup>9</sup> For he spoke, and it came to be; he commanded, and it stood firm.

<sup>10</sup> The Lord brings the counsel of the nations to nothing; he frustrates the plans of the peoples. <sup>11</sup> The counsel of the Lord stands for ever, the thoughts of his heart to all generations. <sup>12</sup> Happy is the nation whose God is the Lord, the people whom he has chosen as his heritage.

**Gospel: Matthew 9.9-13, 18-26**

<sup>9</sup> As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax booth; and he said to him, 'Follow me.' And he got up and followed him.

<sup>10</sup> And as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax-collectors and sinners came and were sitting with him and his disciples. <sup>11</sup> When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, 'Why

does your teacher eat with tax-collectors and sinners?’<sup>12</sup> But when he heard this, he said, ‘Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick.’<sup>13</sup> Go and learn what this means, ‘I desire mercy, not sacrifice.’ For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners.’

<sup>18</sup> While he was saying these things to them, suddenly a leader of the synagogue came in and knelt before him, saying, ‘My daughter has just died; but come and lay your hand on her, and she will live.’<sup>19</sup> And Jesus got up and followed him, with his disciples.<sup>20</sup> Then suddenly a woman who had been suffering from haemorrhages for twelve years came up behind him and touched the fringe of his cloak,<sup>21</sup> for she said to herself, ‘If I only touch his cloak, I will be made well.’<sup>22</sup> Jesus turned, and seeing her he said, ‘Take heart, daughter; your faith has made you well.’ And instantly the woman was made well.<sup>23</sup> When Jesus came to the leader’s house and saw the flute-players and the crowd making a commotion,<sup>24</sup> he said, ‘Go away; for the girl is not dead but sleeping.’ And they

laughed at him.<sup>25</sup> But when the crowd had been put outside, he went in and took her by the hand, and the girl got up.<sup>26</sup> And the report of this spread throughout that district.
